To the members of the Men's Club, we, your Board of Directors, thank each and every member for supporting the Club and the community. We have recently donated \$32,000 to Samaritan Services & SCC Ride. This donation was used to purchase a new Toyota Camry, which will be used for local transportation of our residents.

Samaritan Services provides A remarkable array of services that helps make Sun City Center a safer, healthier, and more enjoyable place to live. Trained volunteers provide most and are free of charge. As a 501(c)3 charity, they provide many support services needed by residents of Greater Sun City Center. They will transport ambulatory residents to medical appointments in Wimauma, Riverview, Brandon, Bradenton, and Tampa, with advance notice of 10 to 14 days. SCC Ride provides transportation for in-town appointments and shopping from 9 AM to 3:00 PM Monday through Friday. Samaritan Services also coordinates the Meals on Wheels program and provides Alzheimer's respite care. For Samaritan Services information, call 813-634-9283. The Men's Club, over the years of service since 1962, has supported the Sun City Center Community with the placement of Chair lifts for the Pools and has been the source of securing the Automatic doors throughout the campus. We have again been called and will replace an automatic door in the atrium. This donation of \$7600 will conclude the need for door replacements. Any new doors from this point on will be with New Build projects.

This is one of the fossils mined!

The Men's Club had a very interesting speaker at our last luncheon who is an expert in Florida fossils. The speaker was Bill Casey, he is a fifth generation Florida native, born in St Petersburg and grew up in Largo. He is a graduate of the University of Tampa and a Florida licensed CPA. He practiced public accounting in Ruskin and Sun City Center for seventeen years. In 1986, he purchased an interest in a shell mining company located South of Ruskin. Bill managed that company and its mining activities until the mineable reserves ran out.

There were additional shell deposits South of Sun City and west of US41. The property owner did not want to mine their property at that time. Ten years later, the landowner had a change of management, and the new managers asked if there was still interest in mining their reserves. In 2018, after six months of contract negotiations and two years of permitting, Bill went back into the mining business with three partners and a new landowner. This mining operation continues to be viable.

The Museum of Science and Industry in Tampa saw fossils as a good educational experience. They sponsored field trips for local schools. From 1983 to 2006 over 40,000 amateur paleontologists and Hillsborough County school students were hosted on fossil hunting trips to the mines. Bill showed some of his personal collection of fossils to the Men's Club including fangs of a Sabre Tooth Tiger and several smaller fossils





The Men's Club annual fundraising cruise for 2023 is a big success as 84 passengers are signed up! That is good news because our Wonder of the Seas cruise set to sail to the eastern Caribbean the week of November 12, 2023 is now sold out!

Our partner, SCC Travelworld, will be contacting those booked passengers in August for final payment for the cruise, and again in late September for payment for our bus transportation to Port Canaveral! Two buses have been contracted in order to have plenty of room. Funds raised for this cruise go into our sponsorship fund to benefit our community. 50% of our funds this year have been earmarked for the SCC Security Patrol!!!






